AT THE MUSEUM

Guided Tours All Guided Tour programs take place at Burnaby Village Museum and include a 90-minute interpreter-led interactive tour. Students are encouraged to use their critical thinking skills to explore museum spaces and dive deeper into curriculum relevant themes.

NAVIGATING THE NEIGHBOURHOOD

Explore a 1920s neighbourhood and make connections to your own community today. This hands-on program includes visits to the Interurban Tram, the General Store, and a Heritage Home, offering insights into both past and present ways of life. Discover the rich variety within neighbourhoods and reflect on how these connections shape understanding of community today.

COAST SALISH PROGRAM

Join Indigenous educators as they showcase different aspects of Coast Salish culture and material practice. Discover how plants, animals, and community intertwine to shape the Coast Salish way of life, both historically and today. This hands-on program makes use of various Indigenous learning sites such as Cedar Grove, the Matriarch's Garden, and the newly renovated Indigenous Learning House.

NEW! VILLAGE VALUES

Explore math in the village with a hands-on adventure. Visit the Bakery to practice measurements, the Bank to learn about budgeting, Cedar Grove to discover geometry in nature, and the Auto Shop to understand distance and mechanical calculations. This interactive experience brings mathematical concepts to life in real-world settings and shows how math is all around us every day.

Students discover how changes in technology and resources have reshaped the world. By visiting the museum's Blacksmith Shop, Tinsmith Shop and Steam Shed, students bridge the past with the present as they learn about industrial change through time.

TA KW'ÍŃEXW TL'A TEMÍXW: ANIMALS OF THIS LAND

Curious about the many different animals that hold a special place in Coast Salish culture? Join an Indigenous educator to uncover fascinating stories about four key animals vital to Coast Salish culture and tradition—Mountain Goats, Coast Salish Woolly Dog, Sockeye Salmon, and Bald Eagles. Students leave understanding the respect and honor Coast Salish people continue to show these animals today.

EXPLORATIONS IN IMMIGRATION:THE CHINESE CANADIAN EXPERIENCE

Have what it takes to be a historian? Students test their skills by analyzing primary sources focused on the Chinese Canadian immigration experience. Learn how Canada's past immigration policies negatively impacted Chinese Canadians and the ways this community persevered and prospered despite discrimination.

AGENTS OF CHANGE

Ever considered how big of a change one person can make? Agents of Change explores six influential people/communities in Burnaby and examines the different ways they each enacted positive change. Students take time to analyze the strategies used by these historic figures and apply them to their own social justice causes becoming agents of change in their own communities.

SUITCASE STORIES

Exploring the contents in five different suitcases, students are tasked with uncovering the stories of the individuals who traveled with them. Through this program students expand their knowledge of the different push and pull factors of migration. Themes include stories of those fleeing Ireland during the Great Famine to Vietnamese Refugees and their journey to Canada in the 1970s and 80's, and more.

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EDUCATION KITS

Education Kits are designed to align with curriculum requirements and incorporate Indigenous cultural objects and teachings. Available for a three week loan, each kit includes cultural artifacts and teacher resources. This rental option supports integrating Indigenous perspectives at your own pace.

The Burnaby Village Museum offers diverse learning opportunities for teachers and their students, including: professional development programs for teachers; the Heritage Fair experience for classes; and valuable research resources through Heritage Burnaby.
